


The Profile contains a very complete picture of St. John's. In it, we are painting a true picture of ourselves –

a portrait that will help candidates understand our needs and situation. It's not always pretty, but it is honest. We define who we are and the community in which we exist. We have many strengths as a church and parish, and we list those. But we have significant challenges; we list those also. We have taken much time to translate the results of the Cottage Meetings into a very specific list of the skills and characteristics we must have in our next Rector. We address our financial and facility situations and their trends and priorities. We discuss our attendance, worship, and leadership history. Our Profile must also allow candidates to see our shortcomings and ask probing and important questions. Finding the best person demands this.

The Profile is in final stages of completion and will be a main Vestry agenda item in January. Even though the Profile is not yet finalized, our vacancy is currently being posted in a limited way nationally with help from the Diocesan office. The completed Profile will be posted on our webpage. As you know, the Vestry is functioning as the search committee, and as such is heavily involved in preparing the Profile. Many thanks to Amy Simons and her invaluable contributions to this effort.


