Living into an Easter Life... What's So Important About Baptism, anyway?

A lot, actually. Baptism is our initiation into the Body of Christ. It is a public recognition that we are all children of God and that we are called to live into our faith with God's help and in His community. In this sacrament, we are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked as Christ's own forever. Baptism builds relationships with sponsors and godparents or simply within our church community. It is also a way that we continue to live into the new life of Easter! Can you remember your baptism? Those of us who came into God's family as adults usually have interesting stories to tell. Those of us who were baptized as infants may fondly remember Sunday School and Nativity plays. Nevertheless, it is why St. John's exists. Baptism is one of the most important things we do and YOU are part of it.

Are you or someone you know thinking of being baptized? Here are some answers to common questions:

- *Do I need to be active in church?* Yes. Because through baptism you are being called into a life with Christ and fellow Christians it is important to be an engaged part of our Christian community.
- Are adults as well as children baptized? Yes!
- **Do adults need Godparents?** Each candidate for baptism has a Godparent (for children) or Sponsor (for adults). It's a way of making sure you don't walk alone in your faith.
- What happens at a baptism? You can read the exact service order on page 299 in a Book of Common Prayer or contact the parish office with any questions. But generally speaking, you are asked to commit to your life as a Christian and the congregation promises to help.

The church generally recognizes several "good" days for baptisms: The Easter Vigil, The Day of Pentecost, All Saints Day, and The First Sunday of Epiphany. Our next opportunity is on **June 12, 2011** (Pentecost). If you or your child is interested in being baptized into God's family please contact our parish office for more information.




St. John's Episcopal Church WELCOMES YOU!
