Traveling Light

In our lives we spend a lot of time accumulating things. Over the holidays perhaps was just a few pounds and some Christmas gifts. But over a lifetime we accumulate so much...especially living here in North America. We accumulate possessions, money, knowledge and ideas, awards and achievements. We also tend to build up unwanted things like fears, resentments and sorrows. This month, which marks the beginning of Lent, is a time for us to look at how we can travel lighter and let go of some of the baggage we accumulated over our lives. Lent is a time for introspection and charitable acts, a time for preparing our hearts for the joy of the Resurrection and letting go of negativity. It is a time for cutting back, taking less and giving more. Lent has always been a lean time for the Church; the fast that prepares for the feast of Easter. Traveling lightly allows us to focus on the most important things in life: Loving God and loving those around us. This love is indeed the only thing that continues on forever.



February 21 @ 6:00pm


