St. John's has a new Rector! Over the next few weeks we will be officially welcoming Father Daniel Cannon to St. John's. Father Daniel, his wife Chrissy and daughter Julia are currently residing in the Tawas area from which Father Daniel will be leaving his four year Priest-In-Charge assignment at Christ Church. Father Daniel is a Michigan native, originally form the Detroit area. He holds a BA degree from the University of

St. John's is offering a special Children's Service that parallels our 10:30 service. Here, the children hear a special "Sermon for Kids" and participate in a short activity. Lunch Bag Outreach

Are you the type of person who likes to see immediate results? Do you like "jumping right in" or "getting your hands dirty?" Well, you won't get your hands *dirty*, but your hands will be *busy* when you volunteer for our Lunch Bag Outreach Program. Monday through Thursday between 9am and Noon our

volunteers distribute between 25 and 50 sack lunches directly to the people who need them most. We assemble the bags, man the door and get face to face with exactly the people we're

helping. Most members volunteer for one day a week, but some are every other week or as substitutes. If you don't want to wait to see the "fruits of your labor" then don't wait to get involved with Lunch Bag Outreach.

Warden's Report

It is a wonderful feeling to welcome The Rev. Daniel Cannon, his wife Chrissy, and daughter Julia to our St. John's family! Be sure to circle two important dates your calendars. On **Sunday**, **September 11**, Father Daniel and family will join us for the **Kick-Off Sunday Potluck**. We think it a good thing that Daniel will have a chance to meet and greet all of us in this more informal setting before his **first official Sunday** as Rector on **September 18**. The timing is perfect to start off the new program year and the next chapter in the long history of St. John's Episcopal Church in Saginaw. By the way – several of you have asked how Father Daniel would like to be addressed. In his own words, "As for what to call me, I will usually refer to myself as Father Daniel so people will know what formal title I prefer (as opposed to Rev. or Pastor), but I am also fine with people referring to me as Daniel."

When we began the search process nearly 15 months ago, we knew it would take the time. There is no more important task for the church and church leadership than calling the next Rector. Along the way we've learned much about ourselves as a parish and our aspirations and dreams for the future of our church and community.

It's definitely time to thank a large number of people for contributions above and beyond the call of duty. I cannot say enough about the commitment, expertise and joy that fellow Vestry members Janet Cosenza, Bill Frederick, Jane Girdham, Connie Grantham, Marcia Hoffman, Sue Marquardt, Duncan Redfield and Dennis Thom brought to the adventure. Add to that list four equally talented and committed folks - Keith Birdsall, Barb Ilkka, Berney Jones, and Ellen Redfield – and you have an extraordinary Search Committee. (Keith deserves special recognition for his ongoing roles in the process. As Senior Warden last year, his leadership in beginning the search process and at the same time keeping the church vital and healthy during the time of transition cannot be overstated. As Chair of the Search Committee after his Vestry term ended, his guidance and wisdom were critical to our success.) Jerry Young added his considerable expertise and understanding of things financial as we prepared the final agreements with Daniel. Bill Scharffe, as a member of Vestry when the process began, contributed early on in very significant ways. Jan Young and Amy Simons were indispensable all along the way – as they are every day in the life of the church. In all things liturgical, and of course musical, Kevin Simons has been the stalwart. Al Gissendanner is used to setting us straight regarding the physical operation of the church, but that role takes on even more meaning when the day-to-day presence of a Rector is missing.

Kevin Simons is Elected to the Sewanee Board of Directors

Each summer our director of music, **Kevin Simons**, disappears for a few weeks to attend the Sewanee Church Music Conference in Sewanee, Tennessee. This year was no different as Kevin, **Jeremy Myers** (former St. John's choral scholar and current choirmaster at St. John's in Mt. Pleasant) and **Jeremiah Kraniak** (current St. John's choral scholar) made their way to "the Holy Mountain" to attend what is the oldest national conference for Anglican musicians in the United States. The conference is limited to 150 attendees who combine to make one choir for the duration of the conference. Rehearsals, seminars by visiting priests, organists or choirmasters and access to new music make for a complete curriculum while the entire experience climaxes in a profound Eucharist celebrated on the final Sunday.



This year, however, was a very special year for Kevin due to his unexpected nomination and election to the conference Board of Directors. Kevin describes the election in this way:

"Sewanee has been a large part of my formation as a church musician and I feel very strongly about its importance in the church. This last year was the 61st conference, and it is the only conference of its kind left in the Episcopal Church. I am deeply honored and humbled by this election, and want to thank you all for the support you have given me which has allowed my continued participation. I look forward to many more years of the Sewanee Church Music Conference!"

Congratulations Kevin, on this terrific honor! We know you will use this opportunity to share your own love and appreciation for church music with a new generation of Anglican musicians!

New Fellowship Opportunity! St. John's is in Stitches!




