Can A Healthier Lunch Be A Cheaper Option?

Yes it can! We've replaced sugary snacks with items such as string cheese, peanuts and real fruit juice. And we've also managed to reduce the cost per bag by about \$0.15! This is another step forward in our continued mission to care for God's people through the St. John's Lunch Bag Outreach Program.

How does the Lunch Bag Outreach Program work? Monday through Thursday form 9:00am till Noon, St. John's serves sack lunches to those in our community most in need. This program is possible because members donate, volunteer to

How Can 4 Hours Help 300 People?

"I really didn't know that there were that many people out there that needed help on a weekly bases." That was Tom Grobaski's first impression to the almost 300 people he served when volunteering at our Old Town Christian Outreach volunteer day. Here, members of St. John's as

well as other area churches help the outreach center distribute food such as cereal, bread, meats and juice. "We set the distribution tables and organize the food. Sometimes people line up overnight to be sure they get something. We pray before we start and we pray at the end. I wouldn't describe it as fun, but rather hugely satisfying." It takes a group of 20 to 30 volunteers to make the process run smoothly; every person counts, particu-



larly on bad-weather days. If you or your family can lend a hand, consider joining your fellow members the fourth Saturday of each month (9am to 1pm).

Outreach isn't limited by the boundaries of a specific program. Check out what these members are doing!

Mary Spence wanted to build a connection with the Council for Abused and Neglected Children in Saginaw. So now members of St. John's knit and crochette hats and mittens to be donated to C.A.N. in November each year!

A New Day For An Old Spade

Many of us bought them initially for good reasons. Because we don't like throwing good things away, we kept them. Now, some sit unused in the musty, cobweb-laden corner of a backyard shed. Others have found a home nestled behind bicycles, air-compressors and lawn mowers in what room remains in a packed garage. Still more have been forgotten in the dank darkness of a forlorn basement, robbing moisture from the air to cast various rusty shapes on the cool concrete floor. Yes, it is time to admit that there may be some old tools and building materials in your home that you just aren't going to use anymore. And it is time to breathe a little new life into the rust and dust by bringing them in for our gently used tools and equipment drive!

For the month of August, St. John's is collecting equipment and materials to begin a partnership with a local non-profit called Kingdom Builders. Kingdom Builders is an organization dedicated to reaching out to the people of East Saginaw by renovating abandoned homes in the area, educating local youth with valuable construction trade skills and work values and loving the people of the neighborhoods by performing weekly acts of kindness. Not only will we be hosting a drive for the equipment needs of Kingdom Builders, but in early September we




will gather together in our worn jeans and work shirts to get our hands dirty by spending the afternoon of September 7th working with the Kingdom Builders' team to clear a vacant lot in preparation for a new playground. - Riding & push lawn mowers
- Rototillers
- Lawn tools: rakes, shovels, trimmers, chainsaws, work gloves, etc.
- Utility trailer for hauling lawn equipment
- Landscape edging and weed block fabric
- Various building materials for remodeling houses: cabinets, toilets, vanities, paint, flooring, wood, trim, etc.

*We ask that all equipment and materials be in working condition.
